

SUPPLIES FOR STUDENT PURCHASE

ART104: DRAWING, FALL SEMESTER 2016

Below is the list of supplies required for student purchase in ART140: Drawing. I have provided example links to each item using [dickblick.com](#) and [target.com](#) but you may also purchase from the SCC Bookstore or other retailers. You do not need to buy the exact brands or styles listed, just something that matches the specifications. The links are provided simply to give you visual context. You will need your supplies by Wednesday, September 14.

1. [Composition Notebook, College Ruled, 9.75" x 7.5"](#)
You will need this notebook as soon as possible, since you begin using it the first week. Yes, you need this particular type and size; standard spiral bound notebooks or blank sketchbooks are not acceptable. Beyond that, you can choose whatever brand or color you prefer.
2. [Pad of Newsprint 18" x 24"](#)
3. Pencils/Pens
I'm not going to hyperlink these, because I make the wacky assumption that you know what they are and why you might need them for an art class.
4. [Apron or Work Shirt](#) (optional but recommended)
We will be drawing primarily with charcoal, which is a sworn enemy of clean clothes. Protect yourself with a set of work clothes or an apron.
5. [Portfolio](#)
Student work cannot be stored in the classroom. You will need a safe way to transport your drawings to make sure they stay in good condition for critique and submission. There are many options for inexpensive purchased portfolios. You can also construct a homemade version by bending or taping together two pieces of matboard, foam core, cardboard or something similar. [Click here for one method of making a portfolio](#). You need something that is at least 18" x 24" to accommodate a variety of work.
6. [Custom Drawing Materials or Surfaces](#) (optional)
You will have the option with some of our assignments to experiment with custom materials and surfaces such as markers, inks, pastels, decorative papers, fabric, wood, metal and glass. This is not required, but if you want to try something, you are responsible for providing it. If you are in doubt about whether a material will work for a particular project, please ask me.
